

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

INTRODUCTION

Every year, Independent Studies at Frontier College publishes a book of student writing. We've been doing this for 20 years. This year, we decided to publish the results of one of our class projects.

We asked the students in our program, as part of a class assignment, to create collages with images and words that represent how Frontier College has impacted them. Students created colour collages which are digitally reproduced as black and white illustrations in this book. Students then used their collages to write short stories about the meaning of Frontier College and the learning they have done while here. Staff, tutors and volunteers assisted the students with their work. The stories are presented along with each student's collage.


What I like about Frontier College

What Frontier College gives to me




CHERYL – STORY

My name is Colette. I go to Frontier College to improve myself in math and reading to better myself. When I read better I will be able to read books. I am very interested in history.


I am not afraid to speak my mind. One of the most important things for me to do in life is to do something to better myself.



sat down and reassured myself. I started to believe in myself and the phrase "see the difference" began reappearing.



Magic: Experiencing magic moments at Frontier. Heaven: Frontier College is a safe place for me. People don't use foul language.


Canadian politics: We talk about this at school. People: People here are friendly. Laughter: People laugh a lot here and smile each other.




This is me now. I am independent and making my own choices and decisions for myself, which is very different from my past feelings.

I feel happy coming to Frontier College because I love this classroom. I have big dreams. I want to learn to read because reading is important to me.



I have courage to learn about the computer. I challenge myself to write the words and spell them.


Before I come to Frontier College I was sad. I like school. I like books to read and writing. I want to succeed.



Through the lessons, Matt's abilities improve. He gains skill in spelling, computers and expressing ideas.



Sometimes I don't know what to do, so I get frustrated. It was difficult to do reading. I had to practice. I like to go to explore and go different places and see nice things.



Peter understands all that is asked of him by students and tutors and over the course of two months, is answering more direct questions. Peter is a great speller and has lots of experiences to write about.


He is able to tell people when he wants their support or not. It is important that we, at Frontier College, listen to Peter. Peter is now learning to set up the computer more independently.


What does Frontier College mean to me


ROBERT – STORY

Every morning I am very happy that the Lord wakes me up and gives me a new day. He is very busy thinking about the war. I am feeling pretty upset about the war.


Frontier College has people here who are open-minded. I am listened to nicely. The future of my world is full of power and glory.

Before I came to Frontier College I was home alone.


I need to know about books and magazines. Reading gives me knowledge. Learning is important to me. I like to talk to my friends at Frontier College. I realize that I can do things for myself.




SYDNEY - STORY
